**Description:** The Finance Department recommends acceptance of a proposal for Property Insurance Coverage for the assets of the Tollway including, but not limited to, bridges, structures, and business interruption coverage for loss of toll income through RSUI Indemnity Company, Westchester Fire Insurance Company, Lloyd’s of London (Terrorism), Westchester Surplus Lines Insurance Company (Earthquake), Colony Specialty Insurance Company (Auto Physical Damage), and the Tollway’s Central Administration facility, electronic data processing, and toll equipment through Federal Insurance Company. The current policies expire on April 1, 2023.

The primary insurance broker for these policies will be Mesirow Insurance Services, Inc. with a BEP partner, Cynasure, Inc. and a wholesale broker, Maximum Independent Brokerage, the wholesale broker for the program.

**Approval of the Retiree Health Insurance Payment to CMS per 5 ILCS 375/11**

**Contract #:** N/A

**Description:** The Tollway is required by 5 ILCS 375/11 of the State Employees Group Insurance Act to reimburse CMS for the cost of other post-employment (medical, dental and life insurance) benefits for Tollway retirees (excluding District 15 Illinois State Police retirees). This payment is required because the Tollway does not participate in the State Employee Group Insurance Plan (SEGIP) for its active employees and, therefore, does not pay the “retiree-load” portion of the monthly premium for active participants like other state agencies do. A portion of the monthly premiums paid by SEGIP participants represents a “retiree-load” determined by CMS. The Tollway sponsors its own benefit plans for active Tollway employees. Prior to 2022, the required payment was calculated based on Tollway pro-rata share of total state service credit multiplied by the retiree’s medical, dental and life premiums.

Legislation enacted on 1/9/2023 amended the State Employees Group Insurance Act to require the Tollway to calculate its share of retiree premiums using the “retiree-load” methodology. The amendment requires the Tollway to remit the “retiree-load” amount for its active employees each month, rather than calculating actual pro-rata service credit of retirees. The Tollway no longer computes pro-rata service credit to determine its payment for retiree medical, dental and life benefits.

This Resolution will allow for the payment of the 2022 premium amount, determined using the amended “retiree-load” methodology.

Approval of the Retiree Health Insurance Payment to CMS per 5 ILCS 375/11 - This Resolution will allow for the payment of the 2022 premium amount, determined using the amended "retiree-load" methodology.

**Reason:** This construction extra work order is for labor, materials, equipment and transport for fabricating and installing lateral bracing and for storing structural steel for a longer period of time. The work is associated with ongoing bridge construction at the I-490 and I-90 interchange. Additional time was required by the Tollway to complete coordination with and secure approvals from the Federal Aviation Administration, City of Chicago and Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago. To minimize schedule impacts and additional costs, the work is being re-sequenced which requires that the time between erection of structural steel and construction of the bridge deck to be longer than anticipated. Lateral bracing is required to be installed to meet stability requirements during that time period. In addition, in lieu of delivering the structural steel and storing it onsite, the Tollway is directing that the Contractor store the structural steel at the fabrication facility for a longer period of time to ensure that it is not impacted due to the elements. The amount of the extra work order is estimated and only actual costs will be paid.
